

**TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF VARIOUS ROADS, WEYMOUTH FOR THE POMMERY
DORSET SEA FOOD FESTIVAL, 8TH-9TH JULY 2017: Ref. 16.W011****TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH ROAD WAITING OR LOADING AND UNLOADING**

For the purpose of The Pommery Dorset Sea Food Festival, DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL has issued a Notice under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to prohibit the use of VARIOUS ROADS, WEYMOUTH by cyclists, horse riders and all mechanically propelled vehicles, except those taking part in the event -

A. Custom House Quay (from South Parade to Town Bridge), St Thomas Street & Town Bridge (from Lower St Edmund Street), North Quay (from Access Road to Council Offices Car Park), Trinity Road and Cove Row will be closed to traffic on:

- (a) Saturday 8th July from 6.00am until 8.00pm
- (b) Sunday 9th July from 8.00am until 8.00pm

B. The Esplanade, between King George III Statue & Pavilion Car Park and Lower St Alban Street & St Thomas Street, between St Nicholas Street & St Edmund Street will be closed to traffic on:

- (a) Saturday 8th July from 11.00am until 8.00pm
- (b) Sunday 9th July from 11.00am until 8.00pm

CSAS Marshals will operate at both closure points to grant restricted access, including Taxis and Private Hire. Access out of the Pavilion car park and vehicles travelling north along the Esplanade are unaffected.

C. Custom House Quay, between The Esplanade & South Parade will be closed to traffic from 6.00am on Saturday 8th July until 8.00pm on Sunday 9th July.

As a result of these closures, the following measures will take effect:-

- (a) In order that access is maintained to and from Nothe Parade, the No Entry Order at Spring Road/Horsford Street will be revoked between 6.00am until 8.00pm Saturday 8th July & 8.00am until 8.00pm Sunday 9th July. The alternative route for vehicular traffic will be via Rodwell Road, Rodwell Avenue, Spring Road and Hope Street.
- (b) Between the hours of 8.00pm on Saturday 8th July and 8.00am on Sunday 9th July the one-way traffic flow in South Parade will be reversed to enable traffic to flow from The Esplanade to Custom House Quay.
- (c) The first three parking spaces outside the Harbour Master's office on Custom House Quay, plus three parking spaces on the Sand Jetty on Trinity Road, will not be available between 9.00am on Friday 7th July and 8.00pm Sunday 9th July.
- (d) Parking spaces will not be available in Custom House Quay (South Parade to Town Bridge), Trinity Road (including the Sand Jetty) and Cove Row between 3.00pm on Friday 7th July and 8.00pm Sunday 9th July.
- (e) Parking spaces will not be available in Custom House Quay, (the Esplanade to South Parade) South Parade and North Quay (the Access Road to Council Offices Car Park & Town Bridge) 6.00am on Saturday 8th July and 8.00pm Sunday 9th July.
- (f) Stop/ Go Boards will operate on the northside carriageway of North Quay, from the Pelican Crossing (adjacent Council Offices Car Park) to the end of the Motorcycle Parking Bay between 8.00pm Saturday 8th July and 6am Sunday 9th July.

The Pelican Crossing will be closed to pedestrians for the duration of the traffic control period and a temporary crossing will be put into operation east of the existing crossing point.

- (g) A temporary (First Buses) passenger bus stop will be sited on the north side carriageway outside the Londis store in Westham Road and operate during the following times:
- (i) Saturday 8th July from 6.00am until 8.00pm
- (ii) Sunday 9th July from 8.00am until 8.00pm

N.B. Blue Badge holders will be unable to park in the area marked out as the temporary bus stop during its operational times.

For the duration of the Dorset Sea Food Festival and, subject to availability:

Permit Holders for Zone L will be permitted to park in the Nothe Car Park when the restrictions above are in operation.

Permit holders for Zone F will be permitted to park in the Swannery Car Park & the Pavilion Car Park when the restrictions above are in operation.
