PWC Lane

Entry / Exit lane ONLY, designated for PWC. Please note that there is a 5mph limit at the shore end of this zone.

Sailboard Approach

This channel is for strict use of non powered craft. No other vessels should enter this lane at any time.

Anchoring Zone

This zone is designated for anchoring vessels. When proceeding to this zone please keep to the 8 knot limit.

Ski Boat Approach

This channel is only for vessels to gain access to the beach to pick up water skiers. Water skiing activities should be kept seaward side of the white 8 knot buoys.

Weymouth Bay Safety Instructions

- 1 All Craft should keep to seaward of the white buoys across Weymouth Bay.
- 2 Do not enter and/or attempt to anchor in the bathing areas shown on the map. Propellers and anchors could seriously injure bathers, therefore, common sense and good seamanship dictate that navigation and mooring in bathing areas should always be avoided.
- 3 The water-skiing channel, marked by red and white buoys, is only for water-ski craft to gain access to the beach. Once passengers and water skiers have been collected from the beach all water ski activities should take place seaward of the white buoys.
- 4 Harbour Byelaws require water ski boats to have a least two people in the boat, whilst engaged in skiing, thus allowing one person to act as lookout astern.
- 5 The jetski channel (marked by red buoys) must only be used to gain access to the beach. After launching, all jetski activities should take place seaward of the white buoys.
