TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER, CUSTOM HOUSE QUAY, WEYMOUTH

DORSET COUNCIL has issued an Order under Section 14 [1] of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 as amended. The Order is needed in order to comply with health and safety regulations which require the provision of safe working areas and to minimise likelihood of danger to highway users.

The Order comes in to operation on 30th September 2019 and will remain in force for 18 months, however it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 31st January 2020.

This Order will enable Dorset Council safe access to replace a section of the harbour wall, and associated works.

The effect of the Order is as follows:

- [1] To close Custom House Quay, from the junction with the Esplanade to approximately Pilgrims Way, a distance of approximately 100 metres.
- [2] To revoke the existing one way order on South Parade, between the Esplande and Custom House Quay and impose two way traffic flow to allow
- [3] To suspend the existing parking bays in South Parade to allow for two way traffic to be maintained for access.
- [4] To suspend the existing parking bays on the Esplanade, 3 x parking bays outside Weymouth Baptist Church and 4 x parking bays opposite the junction with South Parade, on the Esplanade.

For the duration of the order, a locally signed diversion route will be in place, using; The Esplanade - Pilgrims Way - Custom House Quay.
