

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF PART OF CUSTOM HOUSE QUAY, WEYMOUTH FOR QUAYSIDE MUSIC FESTIVAL

DORSET COUNCIL has issued a Notice under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to prohibit the use of the following roads by cyclists, horse riders and all mechanically propelled vehicles, except those taking part in the event and emergency vehicles, to facilitate a public event on the highway.

From Saturday 28 August 2021 at 07:00 until Sunday 29 August at 23:59

Custom House Quay from underneath the town lifting bridge to St. Mary Street.

The alternative routes for through traffic from the west will be via Commercial Road, Lower St Alban Street and St. Thomas Street to St. Edmund Street and from the east via St. Mary Street, St. Edmund Street and Lower St. Edmund Street to Commercial Road.

As a result of this closure, the following other measures will take effect between the times indicated above:

- The diversion route through Lower St. Alban Street and St. Thomas Street will mean that the Prohibition of Driving Order in Lower St. Alban Street which starts at its junction with St Nicholas Street (os Tesco Metro), will be revoked temporarily
- Parking spaces (six bays) in Zone F will not be available on Custom House Quay outside 'The Rendezvous'
- Pedestrian access to the area between 'The Rendezvous' and St. Mary Street on Custom House Quay will be restricted.
- Pedestrian diversion routes are; For Town Bridge, St Marys Street - St Edmund Street. For Commercial Road, St Marys Street - St Edmund Street - Lower St Edmund Street
