
PONTOON LAYOUT


Key to Safety Equipment

Boat Fire Response Plan

If a fire on a boat is reported or observed:

- 1. Immediately call the emergency services (999). Give the full address: Westwey Road, Weymouth DT4 8SU
- 2. Call the Harbour Office (01305 838423) or VHF Channel 12 and report the incident. In silent hours call Dorset Council (01305 838000).
- 3. Ensure there is someone at the pontoon gatehouse to direct the fire services to the incident.
- 4. Identify any casualties and location of casualties.
- 5. Evacuate the pontoons immediately and muster on the pavement outside the entrance gate, clear of the entrance.
- 6. If people are trapped, establish a route to safety using boats if necessary.
- 7. Do not try to tackle the fire.
- 8. Check to see if anyone is missing.
- 9. If it is deemed safe, move the burning vessel to a remote and secure position.
- 10. Also if safe to do so, remove the adjacent boats from the area to provide a fire break down wind from the burning vessel's location.

If in doubt, don't fight a fire yourself. Get out, stay out and wait for fire & rescue services.

Power Failure Emergency Plan

In the event of a power failure the following support systems are in place:

- Emergency lighting system on the pontoons is automatically switched on.
- 2. The electrically powered security gate will automatically switch to manual operation.
- Call the Harbour Office (01305 838423) or VHF Channel 12 and report the incident. In silent hours call Dorset Council (01305 838000).

Man Overboard Procedure

In the event of someone falling into the water from the pontoons:

- 1. Call the emergency services (999). Give the full address: Westwey Road, Weymouth DT4 8SU
- 2. Call the Harbour Office (01305 838423) or VHF Channel 12 and report the incident. In silent hours call Dorset Council (01305 838000).
- 3. Ensure there is someone at the pontoon gatehouse to direct the emergency services to the incident.
- 4. Provide floatation to the person in the water (life-ring, fender). If necessary throw a life ring to the casualty ensuring you hold on to end of heaving line.
- 5. Tow or pull the casualty to a safety ladder if one is located close by or, tow or pull them to an adjacent vessel boarding ladder or, tow/pull to the side of the pontoon/boardwalk.
- 6. Get as many people as you can to assist in the recovery of the person. (Assistance will be required to extract an adult from the water).
- 7. Send someone for blankets or foil wraps.
- 8. After removal from water wrap the casualty in blankets or foil and ask a trained first aid person to check or treat for the effects of drowning and/or hypothermia.

Oil Spill Response Procedure

In the event of fuel or oil being discharged on to the pontoon or in the water:

- Call the Harbour Office (01305 838423) or VHF
 Channel 12 and report the incident. In silent hours call Dorset Council (01305 838000).
- 2. Isolate the source of the leak.
- 3. Try to contain the spread of the oil or fuel.
